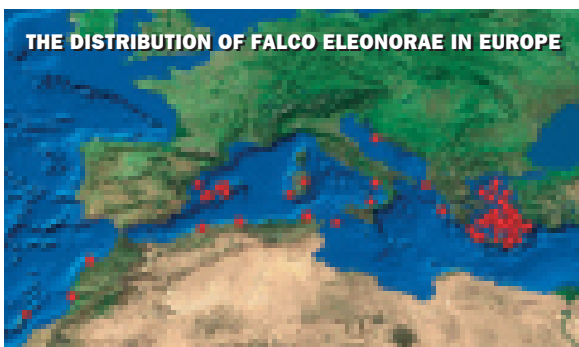


Ways of helping the protection of Eleonora's falcon

- If you find nests of Eleonora's falcon in the area you've disembarked, do not get near them. Leave the area as soon as possible.
- Do not light a fire.
- Never bring pets with you when visiting uninhabited islets, even if you keep them on leash.
- Rats are very often the stowaways of many vessels. They are also able to swim during the night in order to reach the shore. Therefore avoid staying near the islets overnight.
- Do not remove and do not introduce any animal or plant species on the islets.
- If you find a wounded or dead bird, please contact the HOS (Hellenic Ornithological Society) (210 8228704), the Greek Recovery Centre for Wild Fauna (22970 31337, 210 9520117), or the Natural History Museum of Crete (2810 393279, 324366).

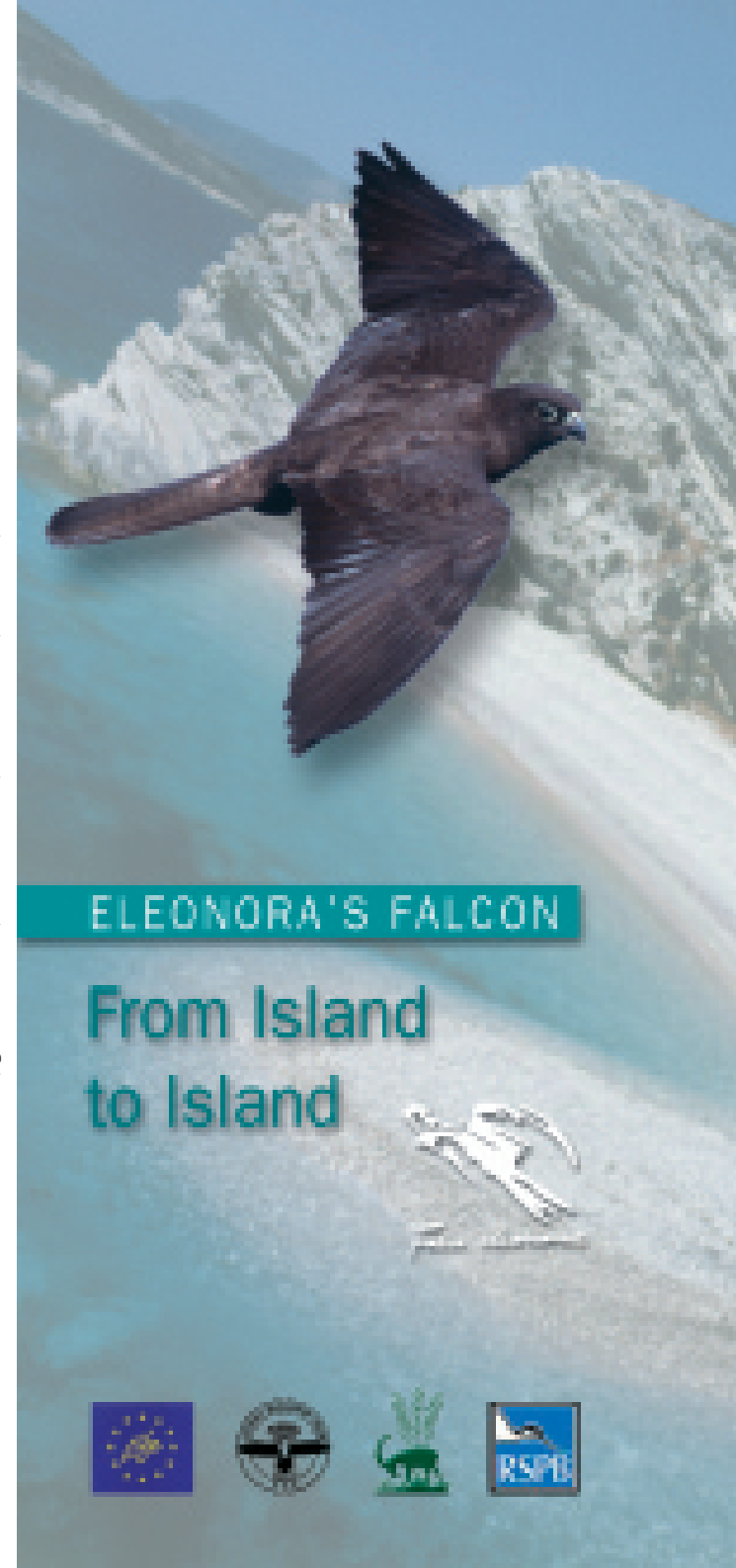
